




Located on the Mediterranean,

Requirements

- 2.75 GPA minimum
- Good academic standing at USF
- Students must have at least one semester remaining at USF after their return

How to Apply to an Exchange Program

Step 1

Select a Program

Select the semester program you are interested in and make an appointment with the appropriate advisor to review your needs. Things to consider:

- ✓ What are your goals?
- ✓ Will your major allow for a semester abroad?
- ✓ Is there a language requirement?
- ✓ Kinds of classes you want to take abroad?
- Is the school an exchange partner or a fee-paying institution?
- ✓ What are the term dates of the program?

Step 2

Gather Application Materials

The education abroad application packet consists of the general application, medical questionnaire, liability waiver, terms and conditions, participant contract and course approval sheet. Forms are available on the website http://global.usf.edu/educationabroad. In addition, you will need to submit:

- **Transcript:** An official transcript from the USF Registrar's Office is required.
- Personal Statement / Letter of Intent

 [500 words]: The most important element of your application, the personal statement gives you the opportunity to explain to the selection committee why you should be selected. Include personal reasons, but more weight is given to academic needs and willingness to act as an ambassador from USF to the host institution.
- Academic Letter of Recommendation: You
 must provide a letter from either a professor
 or an academic advisor who is familiar with
 you as a student and an individual. The
 letter should address academic aptitude,
 adaptability, maturity, and general curiosity.
